Dixon Lake Recreation Area January 30, 2020 – 29 species

Perfect weather at Dixon Lake: Sunny with the temperature rising from the mid-50s into the low 70s. Highlights of a semi-wooded area included Anna's Hummingbirds, a Nuttall's Woodpecker, California Scrub-Jays, House Finches and an intensely yellow male Lesser Goldfinch. A Red-tailed Hawk glided low over a nearby ridge and we heard deep guttural calls of Ravens. On the lake were Pied-billed, Eared and Western Grebes, Cormorants, Ring-necked Ducks, Lesser Scaups, a Bufflehead, Ruddy Ducks, and a few American White Pelicans and Ring-billed Gulls. Along the shore were a Snowy and Great Egret, a Common Gallinule and loudly squawking Great-tailed Grackles.


