Oak Hill Memorial Park

March 5, 2020 – 31 species

This impromptu bird walk provided bright sunshine with temperatures from the low 60s to the upper 70s. The avian highlights were Red-tailed and Red-shouldered Hawks; Acorn and Nuttall's Woodpeckers; Western Bluebirds; a male Lesser Goldfinch boasting bright-yellow breeding plumage; Lark Sparrows and Dark-eyed ("Oregon") Juncos. The day's biggest surprise was a male crested Phainopepla with glossy black plumage. Near the end of our walk, we saw two Great Horned Owls – one barely visible among the fronds of a date palm and the other mostly hidden in the crotch of an old pine.
